

N. Korea to offer information on electricity

North Korea has agreed to provide data on its electric power system, which is rarely released to the outside world, for a Seoul-initiated project to link electric systems between the two Koreas and Russia, the Korea Electrotechnology Research Institute (KERI) said on Friday (June 4).

The state-run think tank headquartered in Changwon, said North Korean officials agreed to provide basic data by the end of July, when they visited Changwon, an industrial city near Busan, last month for a conference on electricity cooperation between the Koreas and Russia.
